- (9) According to Article 18 of Administrative Regulation No.22/2021, students' participation in sports activities shall be applicable to Term 5 & 6 of Article 9 of Administrative Regulation No.15/2014, which regulates the "Physical education and health" teaching activities time in the above table, including morning exercises, eye exercises, stretching exercises, inter-class exercises, etc., shall not be less than 150 minutes in total.
- The school's educational activities throughout the academic year (no less than 195 school days), specifically include three categories —
 "Teaching activities", "Leisure activities" and "Other educational activities". The "Teaching activities" mainly include classroom teaching and examinations or assessments at the end of the semester/term. The number of weeks spent on teaching activities throughout the year = the total number of school days for classroom teaching (excluding examinations or assessments at the end of the semester/term) ÷ number of school days for classroom teaching per week.


- (1) If a course offered in the domain of "Professional and technical" is directly related to a subject in the domain of "Cultural foundation" as mentioned in the above table, and students are offered to study the relevant content through "Professional and technical", the school can be exempted from offering the course in "Cultural foundation" after its application was approved by the authorised entity. However, the requirement for total number of teaching time spent on the domain of "cultural foundation" must be satisfied.
- (2) The class time does not include the assessment sessions at the end of each semester. Each period lasts at least 35 minutes and at most 45 minutes.
- (3) A school may add one or more additional subjects to the domain of "cultural foundation" according to its own educational philosophy and school characteristics, professional characteristics of the courses, needs of the society and student development. These subjects can be either compulsory or elective.
- (4) Including the content of Moral and Civic Education, Geography and History;
- (5) According to the profession of the programme, and complying with Article 9 of Administrative Regulation No.22/2021, the school shall offer relevant subjects or teaching activities with professional practice.
- (6) "Professional internships" must be carried out in an actual occupational environment, consecutively or in separate time phases. The internship work shall not exceed 8 hours per day and 40 hours per week. When the internship is carried out in separate time phases, there must be a period of time containing at least 200 hours.
- (7) Schools can decide and arrange for the time spent on other educational activities in each school year, for activities such as professional practice, specialised arts, cultural education activities, social practice activities, camps, sports days, celebration activities, school opening, closing and graduation ceremony, school parties, etc. However, it should be reasonably arranged and coordinated with the arrangements for teaching and leisure activities.
- (8) The school's educational activities throughout the academic year, specifically include "Teaching activities", "Other educational activities". The "Teaching activities" mainly include classroom teaching and examinations or assessments at the end of the semester/term. The number of weeks spent on teaching activities throughout the year = the total number of school days for classroom teaching (excluding examinations or assessments at the end of the semester/term) ÷ number of school days of classroom teaching per week.


